In the Name of God the Almighty Father, the most merciful, the most omnipotent, the most benevolent, and most glorious Name, amen. We, the undersigned, do hereby witness, declare, and affirm that we have this day witnessed and signed this instrument in the presence of the said Testator, and that we do believe him to be of sound mind, memory, and understanding, and that he has made this instrument in due form, and in accordance with the laws of this Commonwealth; and that we do further declare that we have read and understood the contents of this instrument, and that we do now subscribe our names thereto as witnesses to the same. In witness whereof, we have hereunto set our hands this twenty-third day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-eight, and of this Commonwealth the one hundred and sixtieth.
