2 Mares, one brown and the other a bay, 4 Colts, 3 cows, and five head 20 2 Feather beds and funiture, one half Ditto. The hogs not being all at hand, the best recollection that we can make is 4 Sows, and between 20 and 25 head of young ones, chiefly such as is called shoats. To 1 pot, 1 oven, 1 Axe, 1 hoe, 1 Mattock, 1 Shovel plough, and pair of pot hooks. To 1 dosen of pewter plates, 2 Dishes, 2 Basens, 7 Spoons 4 Knives and 2 Forks. To 2 Tin Buckets, One dozen of cups, one tin coffee pot and 1 Cannester. To one Washing tub, 1 pail, 3 piggins, 2 Churns, 1 Barrel, 1 half-Bushel, 3 Settling and one small Churches. To 1 man and woman, saddle and Bridle, 1 Bedstead and cord, one candlestick and a parcel of Spunthread. To a parcel of flax not broke, I Looking Glass and dress. A pair of Cotton Cards, 6 weight of spun cotton To 1 Big Spinning Theel and one other owing, To 1 Tin Strainer, 1 Horse Collar. To fifty-one and a half gallons of whiskey on demand on January the first day 1812. Not any notes or bonds coming in favor of the Estate nor cash in hand more than will pay the tax this year as I know of. The Corn and other growing property excepted and if anything is left out the same oath I now take shall be binding on me to give it up to the Administrator that acts on the said Estate.

P.14 In the name of God, Amen, I William Lewis, Snr. of the County of White and State of Tennessee being sick and weak in body, but of sound and perfect mind and memory (For which I thank God) and calling to mind the mortality of the body and knowing that it is appointed for all men, once t to die, do make ordain constitute an ordain this my last will and testament, that is to say, principally and first of all, I give and bequeath my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it, my body to the dust to be burried in decent Christian burial at the direction of my executors herein after to be named, nothing doubting, but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the almighty power of God, and as touching and concerning such worldly estate, wheremith, it hath pleased God to help me I give bequeath devise, and dispose of the same in form and manner following, Towit:

lst. I desire that all my just and lawful debts be levied raised and paid out of my personal estate.

2nd. I give and bequeath to my well beloved wife Mary Lewis, all and singular my mension house lands and tenenents, household funiture, farming utensils, and stock of horses, cattle and hogs by her freely to be used and enjoyed for and during her natural life except therefrom, such things as shall herein after be named

3rd. I give and bequeath to my younger son, Thomas Lewis, the tract of land wherein I now live containing sixty acres, and alse, one other tract adjoining containing twenty-nine acres, both held by deed
